The Guardianship Program has been hard at work with court hearings, site visits to Guardianship providers and preparing for the new online database.

**Federal Program Update:** Last month on Friday, October 7, at 2:15pm in the Cochiti Room at the Albuquerque Convention Center, DDPC staff conducted a presentation explaining the five year plan. This presentation took place as a part of the Southwest Conference on Disability. Throughout the month, information has been distributed on programs funded through the Federal Program including the Information Network and the Medical Home Portal. Meetings were also held last month with various contractors and work on the projects listed in the five year plan are underway.

**Center for Self Advocacy Update:** The **Fall Class** is entering its final stages. The advocates are hard at work on projects that will get their concerns on a variety of important topics to the legislature.
