# Section II: Comprehensive Review Update

Administrative Transition: During the first year of the 5-Year Plan the agency had quite a bit of transition in leadership positions. Some activities were delayed during the first half of Year 1. However, significant momentum improved on programs and projects towards the end of Year 1 and the beginning of Year 2. The agency is now progressing on schedule.

HCBS Waiver: The Department of Health's Developmental Disabilities Supports Division (DDSD), who administers the Developmental Disabilities Waiver Services (DDW) for the state, submitted (2011) and received approval of the DDW by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). DDSD has undertaken several initiatives as part of the DDWaiver re-design process and is currently re-assessing/evaluating each individual's level to determine actual services needed using the Supports Intensity Scale (SIS). The intent of the Division is to provide a more efficient allocation of Medicaid funds. Over the past year, the DD community has expressed concerns regarding the evalution process and budget allocation changes. After months of input from constituents, the implementation date of the new DDW Program moved from October 1, 2012 to January 1, 2013. However, there is currently a bill in the Legislature that would require the Department of Health and the Human Services Department to seek federal approval to return to the previous version of the developmental disabilities waiver program assessments, and thus abandon the new version that uses the results of the Supports Intensity Scale (SIS) to place participants into categories with defined levels of services and budgets. The bill would also require the departments to obtain legislative approval before making future changes to the waiver program that would change eligibility or level of service determinations.

One of the DD Council's projects is a campaign to reduce the DDW Waiting List. There is currently a bill awaiting signature based on this effort to put a 5-year plan in place to reduce the waiting list.

Current number approximations regarding the waiver: 3,800: number of clients currently on the Medicaid Developmental Disability Waiver in New Mexico; 6,000: number of people currently on the waiting list to receive DD waiver benefits; 11 years: average time people spend on the DD waiver waiting list; 650: estimated number of people who will move from the waiting list to the waiver by 2016, under changes to DD waiver benefits; \$77,457: current cost per DD waiver patient; \$68,883: estimated cost, per patient, after DD waiver changes take effect.

ACA: There is a bill in the current Legislative Session that would require a study on how the Affordabile Health Care Act would impact DD provider companies who have over 50 employees.

NMDDPC and its network partners continue to meet on a monthly basis to discuss issues and develop joint strategies to address various concerns. Additionally, network partners continue to be active participants in a number of state advisory councils, etc. These include but are not limited to the Medicaid Advisory Committee; Department of Health, Developmental Disabilities Supports Division Advisory Committee on Quality of Services for Individuals w/DD and their Families; Behavioral Health Planning Council and its Medicaid Subcommittee; Behaviorial Health Purchasing Collaborative; Guardianship Advisory Committee; State Rehabilitation

Council; The Disability Coalition with Disability Rights New Mexico (Protection and Advocacy). Problems encountered as a result of collaboration: None significant. **Unexpected benefits:** Network partners continue to be of benefit to each other by participating in the development of programs & systems change and also by sharing information gleaned from participation on various bodies. Issue 4: Waiver Waiting List Description of collaborative issue/barrier or expected outcome: NMDDPC collaborates with the Department of Health's Developmental Disabilties Supports Division which administers the HCBS (Developmental Disabilities Waiver) with the emphasis on advocating for persons with Intellectual/Developmental Disabilties & their families and on systems changes i.e. more individuals will have access to waiver services. Current number approximations regarding the waiver: 3,800: number of clients currently on the Medicaid Developmental Disability Waiver in New Mexico; 6,000: number of people currently on the waiting list to receive DD waiver benefits; 11 years: average time people spend on the DD waiver waiting list; 650: estimated number of people who will move from the waiting list to the waiver by 2016. Life Areas: Recreation Transportation **Health** Self-Determination **M** Housing **Employment** Education Childcare Council roles and responsibilitites in collaboration: NMDDPC continues to work closely with network partners to educate and advocate for additional allocations to the waiver system. NMDDPC continues to collaborate with partners and provide funding to assist persons with DD and family members to educate and inform legislators about the need for additional allotments for waiver services. NMDDPC, together with its partners, was active in the work that lead up to the submission of HCBS Waiver renewal. Problems encountered as a result of collaboration: There is disagreement within the DD Community on new assements, standards and procedures in accordance with the renewed waiver. The Community expresses concerns over the accuracy of the new assesment tool (SIS) and over reduced indivdual budget allocations and services. The Develomental Disabilities Supports Division contends, however that the assesments will provide a more accurate evaluation of individuals needs, enabling more individuals to enroll in HCBS Waiverand therefore reducing the number of individuals on the Central Registry Wait List.

**Unexpected benefits:** 

There have been approximately 10 bills introduced into this year's Legislative Session that deal with various aspects of developmental disabilities services. This brings DD services matters to the forefront which may

provide some resolution to system issues.
